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Contribute to the elaboration of new projects

- **New projects are usually based on ideas from Council members, individual members, partner organisation representatives, corporate sponsors or the EWMA Secretariat.**
- **The general procedure for development of new projects is:**
 - Call issued to all EWMA stakeholders in late August with deadline late September.
 - All proposals received are discussed by Council at the October meeting.
 - Council decides which projects are considered most relevant for further development.
 - The Secretariat develops a more detailed project proposal including a budget estimate for further discussion at the Executive Committee seminar in November/December.
 - The Executive Committee decides on usually 1-3 projects which are sent back to Council for final approval at the March meeting.
 - The Secretariat prepare an industry letter (funding request) for presentation to industry at the March Corporate Sponsor meeting and/or at the EWMA conference.
